Born and raised in Harlem, New York, Dr. Daniel Ibarrondo's experiences have synergistically centered on his multi-faceted areas of expertise in international relations, law, higher education, business, government, and technology. His academic achievements include a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree from *Fordham University* with a major in Political Science and a minor in Puerto Rican Studies; Doctorate in Jurisprudence (J.D.) from the *State University of New York at Buffalo School of Law*; an Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) degree in Bilingual/Bicultural Education from *Seton Hall University*; and a Doctorate in Education (Ed.D.) degree in Learning and Educational Technologies from *Pepperdine University*.
